Eligibility Requirements

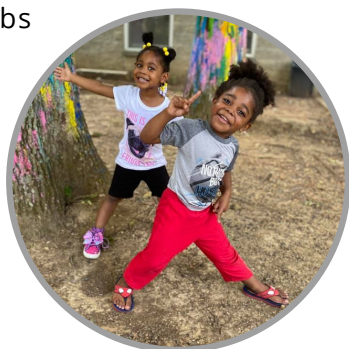
- Family's income must fall within federal poverty guidelines (some exceptions made)

Enrollment Information

- A copy of the birth certificate
- Immunization records
- Income documentation from the last 12 months

Possible Income Documentation

- W2 or 1040 tax form
- WorkOne wage inquiry
- SSI or TANF letter of eligibility
- Financial Aid
- Child Support
- Letter from employer
- 12 consecutive months of check stubs

About Head Start

Head Start promotes school readiness of young children from low-income families throughout Monroe County. Head Start and Early Head Start programs support the comprehensive development of children from health care and education to family services for children ages birth to 5, in centers, child care partner locations, and in their own homes. Head Start services include early learning, health, and family well being.



Head Start

Head Start is a family centered child development program whose mission is to promote school readiness by enhancing the social and cognitive development of children through an evidence based curriculum, health, nutrition, and social services. Parent involvement in the classroom is encouraged.

The Head Start program is designed for families with children who are 3-5 years old. Head Start has 17 classrooms that are 6 hour programs with a variety of start times as well as an affordable extended day program.

Early Head Start

Early Head Start promotes comprehensive early childhood development, and is family centered. All teachers in both Head Start and Early Head Start have a degree or certification in Early Childhood Development or Education to ensure quality teaching.

The Early Head Start program is designed for families with children who are 6 weeks up to 3 years old. Early Head Start has 5, 7 hour classrooms.



Early Head Start Home Based

The home visiting program is designed for families that are expecting through our prenatal program as well as families with children from 6 weeks to 3 years old. Home visitors provide weekly visits offering:

- Parent education, resources, and support
- Individualized curriculum and activity planning for child
- Developmental screenings
- Planning and preparation for birth
- Prenatal education with Early Head Start Nurse
- Enrolled families also participate in monthly socializations with other families. These socialization outings include trips to the Wonderlab, Public Library, and much more!
